(1.) school psychology related topics in an international or intercultural context, (2.) diversity issues, or (3.) issues related to social justice.



THE FASP RESEARCH AWARD

Florida Association of School Psychologists Guidelines for Submitting Proposals

The Research Award is designed to encourage and support the research activities of FASP student members. Any area of research related to the practice of school psychology in Florida may be supported by the FASP Research Award. Special consideration will be given to projects addressing comprehensive service delivery systems in keeping with the NASP Practice Model (e.g., consultation and collaboration, data-based decision making, school-wide practices to promote learning, etc.).

Award Amounts: A maximum of \$250 will be awarded to one student research project.

Guidelines for Proposal: Research applications should not exceed ten (10) typed pages (double-spaced, 12 characters per inch, one-inch margins). The application should be consistent with current APA editorial guidelines. Proposals must be submitted between **by September 1st**. Please organize your proposal as follows:

- Abstract (1 page)
- Introduction and Purpose of the Study (3 pages)
- Methodology (2 pages)
- Results (2 pages)
- Budget (2 pages)

Information Regarding Budget for Expenses: Please provide a comprehensive description of your proposed budget. Include justification regarding why funds are requested in each area and each item's relevance to the research project. If the research award is granted, receipts must be provided to the FASP Executive Board for all expenses paid for by the awarded funds. FASP reserves the right to require funds be repaid if they were not used as indicated in the proposal or budget.
