### 5. Miscellaneous Board Operations (*135 minutes*)

- a. Professional Development Outcome for the Year-Joe reports that the 2026 Annual Conference is being negotiated for St Pete Hilton and should be ready shortly.

Regional Reps workshops-Jamie-going to contact the CE committee in the future. Need to start marketing in mid-November.

PD Committee-met with the CE committee and would like to send out surveys for mini credentialing.

Beacon-sessions will be uploaded into CE Broker and enter in the credits.

- b. Accomplishments and Yearly Overviews-Joe-listed some accomplishments as follows: Innisbrook Conference, Cerra Contract, Beacon contract, Re-engaged with Event Cancellation insurance, new members on the board to get involved, successful SI at no cost to the board, membership has increased, planning Regional Reps workshops, Advocacy Efforts have been maintained.
- c. Pain Points and Problem Solving-worked in pairs to name problems and solutions. The results of the paired discussion were shared online. Some suggestions include having an onboarding process, notifying nonmembers of the accomplishments of the organization, having a virtual legislative update for members, being intentional on social media, suggestion to offer an early bird registration for conference for next year, grassroots drive for membership that is more personal, idea for connecting with others for questions, ways to provide opportunities for more students to attend the conference and get involved in committees.
- d. The Research Committee moves to grant Laurel Snider, Ph.D., a faculty member at the University of Alabama, access to the FASP membership database to solicit research participants for her study titled "Professional Practices of Psychoeducational Assessment of School Psychologists in the United States." This research examines how school psychologists conceptualize, plan, and conduct assessments in school settings. As part of the project, Dr. Snider seeks to disseminate a survey to FASP members to gather information about current practices. There is no anticipated impact on the budget. The motion passed unanimously.
- e. FIU Letter of Support-Joe-Andy Pham has requested a letter of support from FASP for the submission of a grant to train more school psychologists in Miami-Dade County.

Gene put forth a motion to approve the writing of this letter and Liz seconded this motion. Joe will send the letter to all prior to submission. Motion passed unanimously.

- f. Vision Planning-Amy C
  - i. Presented a Motion for all new board members and it was seconded by Jamie. Open positions include ABA chair, Historian and Conference chair. Motion passed unanimously. The new board members for 2026 are listed at the end of the minutes.
  - ii. Interest groups-Joan is coordinating in the following suggested topics: Rural District School Psychologists, Trauma, Mental Health, Early Childhood, Private Practice, School Neuropsychology.
